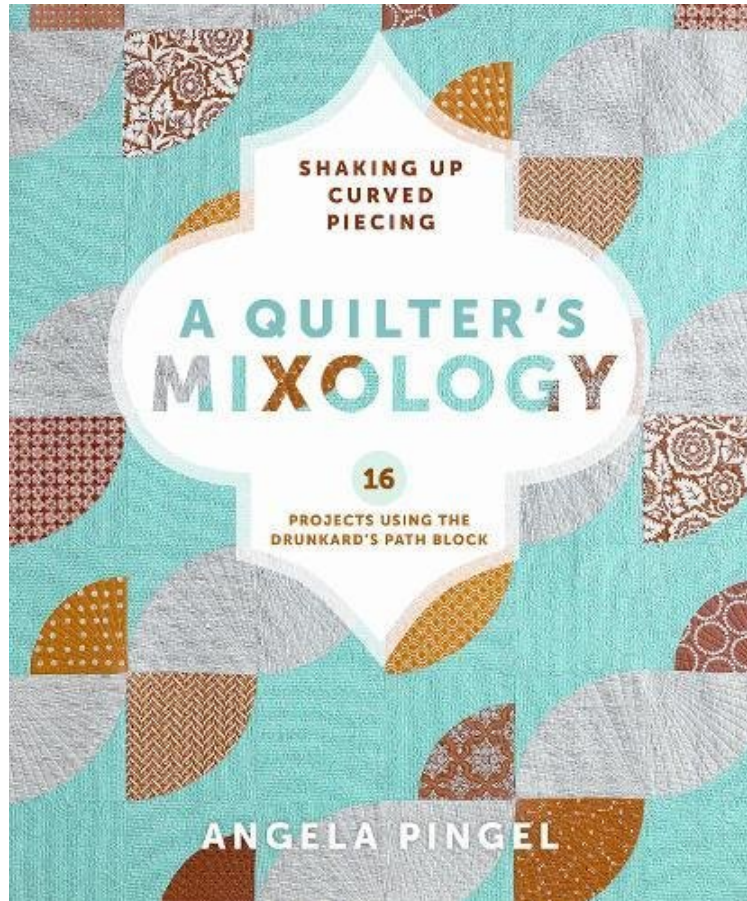

A quilter could choose only 1 block and for the rest of their lives create endless varieties of vastly looking different quilts. Angela Pingel does just that with A Quilter's Mixology. There are 16 varieties in this book, and of those, I would make 10 or so and I really appreciated the rest. Some of the ones I wouldn't make may not have appealed to me, but they opened my eyes to how a person could combine different sizes and dimensions of the Drunkard's Path block with other blocks in one quilt to come up with something more to my taste. This book is a very thoughtful exploration of Drunkard's Path variations. I'd love to see Angela make this book a series- delving into new interpretations of different blocks in future installments. I researched all the different ways to sew the curves and in the end I found the method described in this book to work the best. Each project is broken down to the exact number of pieces you need, with exact measurements. The unit of measurements include inches and centimeters, which I'm sure will appeal to a larger audience. It helps you see how simple manipulation of a Drunkard's Path can create so many different patterns. It also has a paper pattern in the back you can use for size and angle reference. It's a great buy and I would recommend it to anyone who wants to try the Drunkard's Path.
