instructions are clear. I started out doing the bird on page 50, then later I will do the sailboat, but I will modify it to one panel so I can feel accomplished. The basting keeps stitches in place and there is no need for butcher paper, etc. I like this style, and the tiny stitches make everything come together nicely. TAKE the time and read the whole book, then start -- I started on Page 12. You will be pleased, and use tiny needles if you have them, because they work better. I keep everything in a large plastic zip bag so nothing gets lost; and my sewing supplies are kept in a fishing tackle box. I have tried applique for many years, but this is the best application that did not give me a headache, or cause me to give up.
