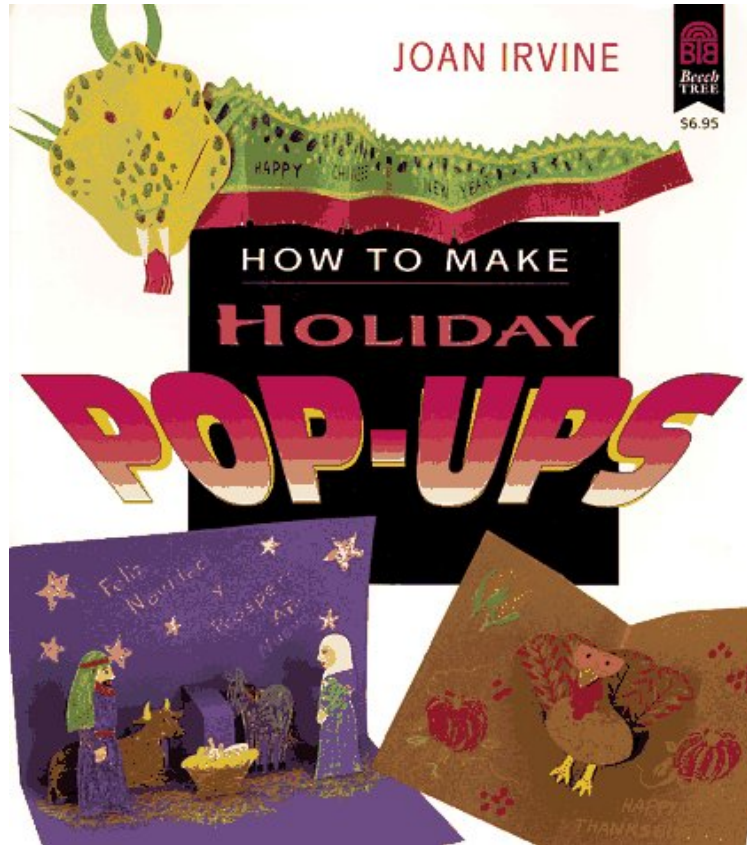

The chapters focus on celebrations within five themes: friendship and love, heritage, faith, people and events, and the new year. Reflecting the multicultural breadth of this book, the section on faith includes the holidays Wesak (Buddhism) and Eid-ul-Fitre (Islam) as well as Easter, Hanukkah, and Christmas. A typical project is presented on a double-page spread with an introduction to the holiday and a series of step-by-step directions. The line- and-watercolor illustrations reinforce the directions and show the finished product. This attractive addition to craft collections will be useful throughout the year.
