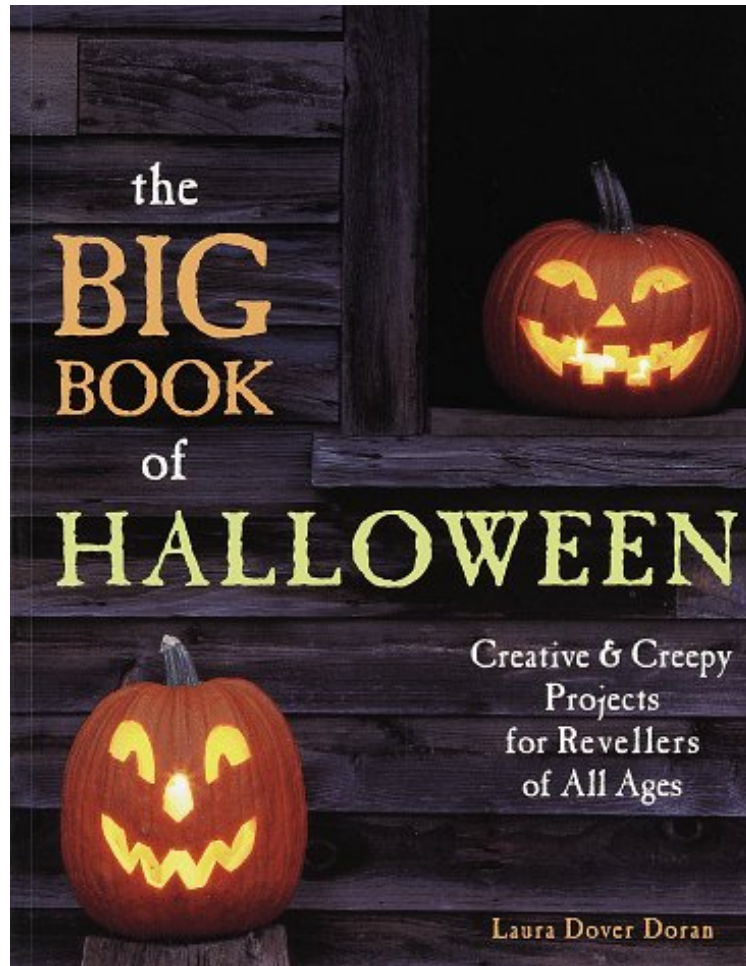

YA-Beginning with a short historical overview and background, Doran focuses on festivities for a contemporary celebration of the occasion. Each separate section covers a main theme perfect for a delightfully frightful time. Ideas and detailed instructions, with photographs, for Devilish Decorations, Spooky Lighting, Eerie Edibles, Clever Costumes, and Frightening Fun are included. The projects range from easily constructed with minimal time required to projects that call for substantially more in the way of the investment of supplies and effort. Instructions are clearly written and the finished products appear on the same page, a bonus for those who like to see what the end result will be without flipping from one end of the book to the other. Tidbits of Halloween trivia are featured throughout. Several stories of reported hauntings, as well as some spooky folktale-type stories, are also included. YAs looking for additional ideas for seasonal fun can find a wealth of information; projects to make or easily adapt; and a variety of foods, costumes, and things to do.
